# A. Resolution No. 2021-22.7 – Resolution Continuing Board of Trustees Authority to Hold Virtual Meetings Pursuant to AB 361

Trustee Rouse voiced concerns regarding the usage of "state of emergency" and "imminent threat" language in the resolution. Superintendent Duncan explained that legal counsel advised that we cannot change the resolution language as it is the language used in Assembly Bill (AB) 361. ### 9. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

#### **Customer Service**

- Coordinating Council meets prior to each board meeting. This is where district level updates, including master schedules, reporting requirements, CALPADS, and grant funding are discussed.
- We continue to work with the superintendents, directors and coordinators of our Member Districts and always share information and offer to provide support.
- Strong Workforce grant funding allows us to provide additional supports for our Alternative Education students. Our new partnerships with the Workforce Innovation Opportunity Act (WIOA) Grant's Youth Innovation Program focuses on expanding work experience and career counseling for our Alternative Education students.
- We hosted our second TEC CTE Symposium, as well as virtual College & Career Exploration Nights, which was a 2-day event.
- Administrative ROP staff have provided substitute classroom support to our Member Districts who are experiencing staff shortages.

## Relationships

- The ACSA Superintendents calls are every Thursday. There is also a bi-weekly call with all of the Alameda County Superintendents.
- Multiple TVROP staff members are part of the ACOE/CDPH calls each Thursday, which address the latest updates/issues related to COVID-19.
- Amy Robbins is our representative for Region 6 at the ACSA CTE Council meetings.
- Superintendent Duncan was an emcee for the cities of Dublin and Pleasanton's Manufacturing Day program.
- Staff attended the CSBA Conference which was back in person this year.
- Staff attended the Innovation Tri-Valley and Education/Workforce Development meetings.

### **Programs**

- TVROP is working with Bay Area Youth Apprenticeship, along with Amos Nugent from PUSD, to explore opportunities for Tri-Valley students.
- Staff is exploring how Las Positas College's Engineering Tech and a Pre-Apprenticeship program might complement our PLTW programs.
- We are working with Cal-JAC and Las Positas College through our Strong Workforce Program Round 3 grant to explore a First Responder Fire Science Academy program.
- We have secured funding for a work-based learning platform called Seamless Work-Based Learning, which is a great program for storing all of the data that can be accessed by all.
- Staff is working with Tekagogo to offer a summer camp this year for Tri-Valley students interested in the trades.

- DECA has resumed in-person competitions, and we have a number of upcoming events.
- Staff are redesigning the TVROP website.
- We hosted the 7<sup>th</sup> Annual Advisory Night virtually, which was highly attended.

### **Fiscal**

- Superintendent Duncan is a member of the Steering Committee for the JPA Coalition, which was integral in securing the COVID Supplemental Funds for ROC/P's.
- We submitted two Round 4 Strong Workforce grants projects and were awarded in full for a total of \$1.2 million.
- We are working with GAMUT/CSBA on updating our board policies.
- In January, we are supposed to find out our CTEIG allocation.

Trustee Miller reported that PUSD was able to come to an agreement with APT.

Trustee Prusso said she attended both the CTE Symposium and the Advisory Meeting, both of which were wonderful events. LVJUSD trustees were able to get together to celebrate the Youth Build program and meet the students.
