9. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Superintendent Duncan reported on recent meetings, activities, or legislation.

Customer Service:

- Superintendent Duncan met with Amador Valley High School students lead team for the College and Career Expo at Amador Valley High School to plan for the October 23, 2023 event.
- Organizing, with three Member District cities, a Manufacturing Day as we have done in past
 years, tentatively scheduled for October 20, 2024. The day would include touring two
 advanced manufacturing sites with lunch.
- Dawn has developed and instituted a new check-in/out procedure for teachers to streamline tasks and promote positive ownership of teacher/classified required tasks. Evaluation of the systems will be reviewed in the coming months so that at the end of this year and the start of the next school year we will be even more efficient.

Programs:

- Superintendent Duncan and Suzanne worked with Bay Area LEEDS to hold three successful STEM camps at LPC this summer as well as offer Teacher Externships as a result of the K12 SWP Round 4 grant dollars.
- Suzanne and Dawn put together a dynamic kick off In-Service for the year with an ALL IN theme.
- Amy Brown is now located at the new Middle College Center, Building 400 on campus. We are hosting an Open House on October 19, 2023 between 6-8 PM.
- Superintendent Duncan and Suzanne Smith met with Kaiser Permanente to hopefully reengage our students into their network for internships placements.

- Amy Brown, Kelly Mogilefsky, and new and former Middle College students have been selected to present at the Community College Early College Middle College Dual Enrollment Summit this Friday and Saturday in San Diego at the summit's luncheon. We are very proud of the highlighted recognition and outstanding Golden Bell winning program we offer students.
- Dawn is working with TOSA teachers to prepare for internship site development with medical programs.
- Suzanne is working to coordinate with Member District Partners to host our Advisory Night, November 8, 2023, site to be determined.

Fiscal Management:

- Suzanne secured and was recognized as an exemplary program for the use of WIOA funding
 to provide additional college and career counseling, mentoring, and 21st Century skills and
 financial literacy workshops to Title 1 eligible students in the Tri-Valley's Alternative Ed.
 Programs. We received the highest success rate of 90%.
- Worked all of 2022-23 and over the summer with Member Districts and the K-16
 Collaboration Grant team for the Bay Region, which includes UC Berkeley, Chabot Las
 Positas, and surrounding JPA districts as a member of the Core Partners team for submission
 of the Implementation grant. Unfortunately, the dollars will be primarily spent at higher ed
 and only districts on the other side of the county. We will not receive direct funding but
 services. LPC will receive~\$380K for dual enrollment opportunities for a 30-month period.
- Hired a technology consultant as part of the K12 SWP #5 to oversee the onboarding of our new MFA system and begin the work of developing an ICT Pathway with a work based component for students to have a technology repair shop that can be replicated across the state.
- Suzanne was awarded the ECMC Grant of \$250,0000 to support the Middle College program.
- Finalized the technology MFA DUO rollout of all district computers to ensure the tightest of security measures form Malware and Ransomware attacks.
- Writing the CTEIG 2023-24 grant application with Member Districts to hopefully secure \$3M+ in funding to maintain and enhance CTE programs.

Relationships:

- Assisted in the coordination of a Wheels Tri-city meeting with the new lead Director.
- Suzanne was just selected to the K12 Strong Workforce Selection Committee for Round 6 of K12 SWP grant.
- On Monday, September 11, 2023, Superintendent Duncan participated in her first Executive Committee meeting for the North Coast Section as the Superintendent representative for the entire North Coast Section. Superintendent Duncan is the NCS Alameda Superintendent Representative.
